





HIGHLIGHTS

- The Covid-19 vaccination campaign started in March, 2021 in accordance with the National Plan for the Introduction of Vaccination against COVID-19 (PNIV) published in the Official Bulletin No. 19, February 18, 2021;
- As of March 31, approximately 321 947 (98.8% of the target population) were vaccinated with the first dose of the vaccine against COVID-19 and 282 143 (86.6%) of the eligible population were vaccinated with the second dose;
- By March 31, 110.4% (242 621) of the general eligible population (≥ 18 years of age who do not belong to the risk groups defined in the PNIV against COVID-19) had been vaccinated with the first dose;
- As of March 31, 128 324 (39.4%) booster doses had been administered in adults.
- As of March 31, 47 983 adolescents (89.2% of the eligible population) were vaccinated with one dose against Covid-19 and 40 771 (75.8%) were fully vaccinated.
- As of March 31, 28 827 (43.6%) children from 5 to 11 years old have been vaccinated with the first dose of the vaccine against COVID-19 and 21 260 (32.2%) were fully vaccinated.
- As of March 31, the country had administered 847 328 (74,8%) of the vaccines received through the COVAX mechanism and donations from partner countries;



Actions carried out

- Publication of the National Plan for the Introduction of Vaccination against Covid-19 https://Covid19.cv/wp-content/uploads/2021/02/bo 18-02-2021 19-ok.pdf
- Official publication of the establishment of the National Committee for the management of adverse events following immunization (AEFI).

- Publication of Resolution No. 82/2021, which approved the requirement to present a valid negative RT-PCR or antigen test result, every fourteen days, or a COVID Vaccination Certificate, by public and private service providers that provide customer services or who have direct contact with the public, as well as those who share common spaces and means of transport with them, as a public health protection measure and to reinforce vaccination efforts, in view of the COVID-19 pandemic. https://covid19.cv/wp-content/uploads/2021/08/bo 23-08-2021 81.pdf
- Approval of the COVID-19 Certificate, as a document proving the low risk of its holder being an active COVID-19 patient and as a measure to facilitate free movement and the carrying out of activities in the context of the Covid-19 pandemic. Approval of issuance, verification, and acceptance of COVID Certificates from Cabo Verde and recognition of COVID Certificates issued by other countries or multilateral institutions. https://covid19.cv/wp-content/uploads/2021/07/bo 30-07-2021 75.pdf
- Start of Vaccination of Adolescents from 12 to 17 years old with the Pfizer vaccine. The vaccination strategy used was vaccination in schools and high schools in the country, requiring parental authorization by signing the consent form.

- Beginning of the application of the booster dose or 3rd dose to people over 60 years of age, people with chronic illnesses, Health Professionals, Firefighters, Civil Protection professionals, professionals at entry points, Police, Military personnel, teachers and support staff at schools, Civil Aviation and Maritime professionals as well as workers in the Tourism sector. - The application of booster doses is now available to the general population over 18 years of age who had taken the 2nd dose of the vaccine, for more than 3 months and the Moderna Vaccine is being used in accordance with DNS directive, from January 4, 2022.
- The Ministry of Healthy has introduced the vaccination against COVID-19 in children from 5 to 11 years old, through the Extended Vaccination Program, in healty centers, kindergarten and schools.https://minsaude.gov.cv/noticias/primeiro-ministro-lanca-a-camapanha-de-vacinacao-contra-covid19-para-criancas-dos-5-aos-11-anos/.



As of the March 31, Cabo Verde had administered **847 328 (74.8%)** doses of the available vaccines **521** more doses than in the previous month.

From the June 28 to March 31, 2023, **133 076** young people aged between 18 and 39 years had received the one (1) dose of the vaccine against COVID-19, this represents **74.0%** of the estimated population in this age group for the current year, (data from Census 2021 by INE).

In relation to the booster dose, 128 324 doses have been administered in adults (39.3%) of the eligible adult population 208 more doses than in the previous month.

As of March 31, 2023, **47 983 (89.2%)** of the estimated eligible adolescent population were vaccinated with the first dose against Covid-19, nine (9) more than in the previous month and **40 771 (75.8%)** were fully vaccinated, six (6) more than in previous month.

As of March 31, a total of 28 827 (43.6%) children from 5 to 11 years have been vaccinated with the first dose of the vaccine against COVID-19, 15 more than in the previous month and 21 260 (32.2%) were fully vaccinated, 58 more than in the previous month.




Figure 2. Percentage of children vaccinated with a dose of vaccine against Covid-19 by municipality, Cape Verde, March 31, 2023

Recommendations from health authorities

- If you experience any symptoms after vaccination, contact the nearest health centre or call the free hotline 800 11 12 for guidance or through the website https://covid19.cv/vacinas/ and fill in the form to report adverse effects following immunization to the Independent Health Regulatory Authority (ERIS).
- Keep the vaccination certificate that serves as proof of vaccination against the COVID-19.
- The booster dose is available for the entire population over 18 years of age who have completed their vaccination schedule for more than 3 months, in two doses.
- The **Nha Card** platform that issues the Covid19 certificate with a booster dose. Request or renew your certificate on the website: www.nhacard.gov.cv
- People vaccinated with the first dose and who have already completed 2 months, should look for the vaccination posts to take their second dose of vaccine. To take the booster dose the person must have completed 3 months after taking their 2nd dose.
